[Kurzweil](#) and [Read and Write Gold](#) do it too for money.

[Premier's Text-to-Audio](#) converts text to audio files and says it automatically divides Word files into audio segments and burns CDs, so that might be good if it automatically split up chapters into different audio files

[Dolphin](#) might also be good because I think it will also split up documents into indexed audio files. It also does Daisy audio.

[WordTalk](#) - free to all schools.

[Textease](#) – relatively cheap – very powerful – in all Highland primary schools. Also allows for direct voice recording.

[Inspiration](#) – text-to-speech availability within the context of mapping/organizational software. Also allows for direct voice recording.
